The Google email provided by your district is filtered for inappropriate content and spam. It can be accessed

from any Web browser. Teachers can create mailing lists for their classes and use them as discussion boards.

Calendars

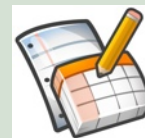


Share Calendars

Calendars can be used by your district, academic groups, individual teachers, and your students. Just like the email, the calendars can

be accessed from any Web browser. You can subscribe to them and share resources.

The online docs set includes documents, spreadsheets, and presentations. Students can create and edit their work at school, home, grandma's

house, or the library. (There is even an option for offline work.) The documents can be shared with other students for group projects and with teachers for feedback and grading.

Sites is a great publishing tool. Teachers can easily create a class or project website. Students can show off work they have done.

Many districts will use Google sites for student e-portfolios.

Oregon is excited to be the first state in the nation to partner with Google to offer email and online applications for K-12 public school districts in the state.



The service includes tools that allow students and teachers to create, communicate, and collaborate online. The agreement between Oregon and Google lets us provide them on no-cost, advertising-free, filtered, and protected domains for use in our schools.



What does this mean for ILC members? Your district has flexibility to offer or not offer each of the services in the box on the right. You can also set different levels of

protection. For example, if you choose to set up email accounts for K-5 school students, you can set the accounts to receive email only from approved senders.

Important Points

- ✓ Districts can request Google Apps training sessions. These sessions can be done in person or via WebEx. The training team tailors presentations for your group. Popular sessions include curriculum integration, PLC, and online apps in the classroom.
- ✓ In our informal survey, over 50% of Oregon teachers are already using Google in their daily or classroom life. The apps have grassroots appeal and are easy to adopt. Teachers use docs for class projects. Principals use forms for staff development. How can we further support your work?
